OTHER BUSINESS

Public Comments – Scott Marsh, R&B Director- has received comments from local people, police department and other entities if we can get the speed limit reduced out by the hospital on Hwy 13 to 50 mph instead of 65. Scott would like to have Commissioner their support and have them talk with CDOT to help with this. They should set out reasons why we think it's important now that there's so many trucks and traffic going through Meeker now that Glenwood Canyon is closed. Scott said that people from CDOT have said they're previously done speed analysis and it's not warranted at this time.

County Commissioner Updates

Commissioner Gates attended a Rascal Recovery meeting and mentioned they are having another one September 8th in Meeker. Ty met with staff over various issues and worked with local governments regarding the opioid settlement.

Commissioner Rector had a Hwy 13 speed limit discussion with and met with Scott Marsh regarding new Ideas with R & B and the discussions they have had. Jeff stated he has had a lot of conversation about the 4 day work week. He set in on a WIR call where they talked a lot about the water issues and shortage of water.

Chairman Moyer went on the Drought Tour that was put on by the Water Conservation Board. The Director of Natural Resources, the Director of DOLA and the Commissioner of Agriculture and many of their staff were on this tour. They discussed both sides of the water issue, Steamboat Springs was the first stop and they went to other stops north of Craig that really emphasized the severity of the drought. The showers received in the White River valley put us in a lot better shape than folks north of us. Alden and Callie were presenters and the Governor who had just been to Glenwood Canyon was there and he indicated they would be opening the Canyon on Saturday, but there would be some scheduled closures at night in the Canyon to do additional work. Gary asked if he would notify the communities on the alternative route so they could have a heads up. The Governor indicated that they would. Gary asked the Governor about our county, as far as our BOCC, would appreciate it if we wouldn't see any COVID mandates coming from the state. The Governor stated he didn't see any more coming at this time. The next day was focused on forest health and the use of water.

With no further business to come before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 11:29 p.m.
